



Sea Lochs and Kyles of Bute 3-nights

Whole boat charter for 6 people £1260 all-inclusive (only £210 per person) or £225 per person coming on board a mixed guest holiday

Departs from Holy Loch, Dunoon on a Saturday or a Tuesday at 3 pm and disembarks the following Tuesday or Friday at 11am.

This holiday explores many of the sea lochs of the Cowal peninsula, rich in wildlife and with some of the most beautiful scenery on the West Coast of Scotland. Loch Goil, Loch Long, the Kyles of Bute leading to remote Loch Riddon and Loch Striven provide a playground of sheltered waters for learning to sail and navigate. For extra fun, bring your kayak, windsurfer and swim from the boat or go ashore with your walking boots and bicycle to explore the coastline. If the wind, weather and tide permits you may go as far afield as the Island of Arran.

Example holiday itinerary

- **Day 1** Sail Loch Long and Loch Goil and experiment with sailing and navigating one of the smallest "Tall Ships". Anchor off Carrick Castle for your first dinner on board and go ashore by tender for an evening stroll
- **Day 2** In the morning head for the beautiful Kyles of Bute and explore the sea lochs of Riddon and Striven, watching for grey seals and marine birdlife. After dinner lay lobster pots or try fishing from the boat tender
- **Day 3** If the weather allows, sail across the Sound of Bute for Arran or explore the south of Loch Fyne which is excellent for water based activities
- **Day 4** After breakfast, head back to Holy Loch for disembarking at 11am

This holiday may be available for departing on other days of the week, and for a longer duration, please contact us to discuss your requirements

***Getting to Holy Loch:** If arriving by train to Glasgow, take the connection to Gourock which includes the ferry trip to Dunoon. If arriving at Glasgow Airport, we provide a free pick up at 2pm on the Saturday for boarding at Holy Loch at 4pm. If arriving by car, free parking is available at Holy Loch Marina which is secured by locked gates at night.*
